NACUA offers members the opportunity to volunteer to serve as a speaker or moderator at several live and virtual meetings each year including the Annual Conference, Spring and Fall CLE Workshops, Virtual Seminars, and Online Courses.

One of the key ways to become a speaker through NACUA is to develop expertise and experience in a particular subject matter. Here are some ways to get more involved in the Association:

- Update your bio and areas of expertise in your NACUANET profile.
- Volunteer to serve as a NACUANET group leader on a specific topic. Staff Contact: Kandace Gilligan at kgilligan@nacua.org.
- Volunteer to serve on the CLE Committee or Program Committee and on a specific planning group that matches your area of expertise. Staff contact: Ashley Miller at amiller@nacua.org.

- Submit an Annual Conference topic proposal form identifying a topic on which you would be interested in speaking.
