Each of NACUA’s programs provides members with different speaking volunteer opportunities including session presenters, moderators, discussion group leaders, Webinar speakers and Online Course instructors.

How are NACUA's speakers selected?

NACUA's CLE Workshops and Annual Conference sessions are developed by planning groups of member volunteers of the CLE Committee and the Annual Program Committee. Each session is assigned a coordinator who plans and recruits speakers for his or her session. Session Coordinators look to these factors when identifying speakers:

- Expertise and experience in a subject matter
- Presentation Skills
- Expected quality of written materials
- Individual and institutional diversity and balance

NACUA staff members plan Webinars and Online Courses and use the same criteria to select speakers as our live programming.
